Our theme for this Assembly is "**We are...** Rocks". I want us to be used by God in any and every circumstance. Jesus said to Peter in Matthew 16:18 that he would use Peter. New Nazarenes
 This year we received 172 new Nazarenes. This is up 27 from last year.
 Conversions
 We had 391 conversions this year. 116 more than last year. 36 of our 55

churches saw conversions 196 total Baptisms. 63 more than last year.

Baptisms

This year the EKD planted one new church. Through the leadership of Rev. Chuck and Lisa Chapman, the Recovery Community Church was birthed. In September of last year, our Erlanger GracePointe Church gave a blessing to the Chapman's to go out as missionaries to Northern Kentucky and beyond serving the Lord through the Church of the Nazarene. Many strides have been made along the way. In his report you will read just a couple of pivotal moments in the life of this new church. I am thanking God for their obedience and the lives being changed.

We saw our new churches from last year strengthen:

- ❖ Hope Place Meeting the needs of the unchurched in Corbin.
- ❖ Bread of Life PAC Church of Lloyd ministering to the hungry and lost through compassion.
- ❖ Assembly of the Saints PAC Church of Independence Generations A Congolese Congregation becoming a Church of the Nazarene through the leadership of Rev. Dave Mills and our Independence Generations Church.

I praise God for the great reports from each of these new works as we continue to see His church move forward.

We are... Rocks

It is imperative that each of our churches makes as its goal to reach the lost in our communities and counties. Don't mistake the last sentence to be something the District Superintendent is requesting. No no no!!! This is a COMMAND of Jesus. The church and our Christian walk was never designed to be about comfort, preference, or getting fat on the word and doing nothing with it. The church and persons Jesus desires is about "going into the world". My Jesus was more concerned about seeking that which was lost than making the religious happy or comfortable.

Most every church board I meet with tells me they are willing to do whatever it takes to reach the lost. Sometimes I even ask them to raise their hands if they really mean it, whatever it takes and it is unanimous. All hands raised. I ask you today, are you a yes person or a no person. Jesus wants yes people. Whatever it takes means I will love everyone, do anything, sacrifice my own comfort or preference for what someone else needs in order to find Jesus. This isn't just about music, lifestyles, carpet, tattoos, marks on the walls, and filth although it very well could be. At the heart of this is, am I willing to do whatever? Really whatever? All people are in need of Jesus and Jesus himself showed us through His example He loves everyone. He loved the adulterer, the tax collector, the robber on the cross, and the murderer on the cross, the drunk, and the scripture is full of those Jesus showed us to love. We are to love like that. The lost in our families and communities are hurting, abused, abusing, homeless, hungry, persecuted, mistreated, confused, mistreating, LGBTQ, and all LOST. God help us to love the lost.

When the census was taken it recorded there were **1.4** million in population on our district. It also stated that **802,000** of the 1.4 million did **not claim a church** home. That is **57.3%** of our population do not claim a church home. This fact should remind us all of the lost we are accountable to share the love of Christ with. There are lost people waiting on us to share Christ with them in our towns, cities, and counties.

There are churches that need planted, sponsored, and mothered. Our existing churches need to reinvent themselves, refocus and be revitalized. The first and most important way to know if your church needs to change. Look in your handbook and see how many conversions there were last year from your church. Now you know if there needs to be a change. At the least, annually 100% of our EKD churches should show conversions. Please hear me. My

heart breaks for the struggling church. I weep when a church gets to the point of needing to close. One new convert will change your focus and help the church refocus on what is important. We must see: new converts, baptisms, new Nazarenes, intentional discipleship (NDI), and living out missions both locally and globally.

I have asked each of our pastors to have a mentor in their life. This is someone who has been where they want to be spiritually, positionally, and experientially. Additionally, our District Licensed Pastors have mentors. Through the Board of Ministry, we are requiring each student to have a mentor and follow a plan.

This past fall Joni and I had the privilege of visiting a very special religious site in Greece. It was the archeological site of Philippi. We sat in the amphitheater of the Roman ruins. I thought about the many that sat where I was sitting. Joni, our daughter-in-law Sierra, and I sat there while our son Lane read from Philippians. We got up and made our way through more ruins until we stopped at the actual prison cell of Paul and Silas. This is the cell they were in while living out Acts 16. In 16:25 it says "About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. 26 Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everyone's chains came loose. ... 29 The jailer called for lights, rushed in and fell trembling before Paul and Silas. 30 He then brought them out and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" I hope at your midnights you are praying and singing so prisoners and jailers here you and want to be saved. I believe the real reason Paul and Silas were in prison and going through what they went through was because there was a lost jailer who needed Jesus. Try to remember in you're life the reason for the is because somebody is in need of Jesus.

In Matthew 16 there is an exchange that goes on between Jesus and Peter. Jesus asks Peter in verse 15 "Who do you say I am?" 16 Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." 17 Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. 18 And I tell you that you are Peter,[b] and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. 19 I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

We are... Rocks - On this rock I will build my church." Matthew 16:18. I hope now it makes since. The Peter who after Matthew 16 still denied Christ was told by Jesus ... on the Rock. I believe we need to be a rock. Truthfully we need to be whatever Jesus needs us to be, a rock, a servant, a hair stylist, a prisoner, teacher, an insurance agent, a cook, a server, a doctor, a sales person, a leader, a flight attendant, a miner, a preacher, a factory worker if you are God's child you are called by Him to be used by him.
